

Wallingford Bookshop Christmas review!



The River & Rowing Museum, Henley Skyscape: The limitless art of the sky



A new exhibition celebrating 500 years of artists' fascination with the sky has opened at the River & Rowing Museum in Henley. Inspired by Constable's famous statement that "It will be difficult to name a class of landscape in which the sky is not the key note", **Skyscape** is an exciting opportunity to view the popular art of landscape from a new perspective, through a succession of masterpieces that span 500 years of European art.

The exhibition is organised by the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford, and features masterpieces of some of history's most celebrated artists including Rembrandt, J M W Turner, Samuel Palmer, John Ruskin, Paul Nash, and local artist, John Piper. Commissioned by Queen Elizabeth in 1941 to make a series of topographical records of Windsor Castle, Piper's stormy skies over the royal residence represented imminent threat of the War and the Luftwaffe.

This sombre symbolism seems to have been lost on King George VI who wryly remarked "you seem to have very bad luck with your weather, Mr Piper".

The exhibition is open from now until 16th January 2022 during the normal opening hours of the River & Rowing Museum, Thursday to Monday, 10am to 4pm. Visitors can plan their visit now by booking General Admission tickets which include entry to **Skyscape** and the opportunity to enjoy the rest of the Museum, Cafe and Shop after the exhibition. Stephen Barker: 'Five Indian Pilots of the Great War'

In November 1916, the Royal Flying Corps began an experiment to recruit for the first time, Indians resident in Britain. Prior to that, men such as these were unable to enlist owing to a 'colour-bar'. Why was there a change of policy and what would be the experiences of these five men? The presentation is fully illustrated and includes both audio and video clips.

Stephen Barker is a Heritage Adviser, specialising in consultancy for those applying to fund projects with military history themes. He specialises in work relating to the First World War and British Civil Wars. His interest lies in promoting people's understanding of their military heritage, making the past interesting, relevant and exciting for a variety of different audiences.

Citizens Advice on coping with Universal Credit shortfall

This year, the month of September ushered in more ominous portents than chilly winds and dark nights: the Government reduced Universal Credit payments by £20 a week. This move could put many floundering people in a critical situation. Rising prices and the coming end of the pandemic furlough have joined other negative trends to put millions in serious debt, unable to pay vital bills and about to see life get even worse.

But, if you are in this position, remember that support and help are available and you need not suffer alone. Take charge of your situation. Start by making a list of what you owe and add up what you need to pay out each month. This list puts your financial position clearly in front of you in black and white. Next, prioritise your debts. There is advice on the Citizens Advice website to help you do this: https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money Some bills are more urgent than others. Rent or mortgage arrears, gas and electricity bills and Council Tax count as priority debts as there could be serious consequences if you don't pay them.

Get in touch with the companies to whom you owe money. Not everybody feels confident about doing this but the organisations expect such calls and they might be able to help by letting you pay smaller amounts over a longer period or even take a temporary payment break.

The government-backed Breathing Space scheme could also give you extra time to pay. See our website for details or www.gov.uk If you are eligible, you could get 60 days during which your creditors can't contact you, take any action against you or add interest and charges to your debt. A Citizens Advice adviser can check your debts to see if they are covered by the scheme.

If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call the Citizens Advice debt helpline on **0800 240 4420**. It really helps to make personal contact with somebody who understands. You can also call our Adviceline free on **0808 278 7907** (Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm) or try our webchat (click on "chat with us online about debt").



Visit Ayres House Studios this November & December

'Heart of Nature' will be open from the 1st to the 14th Nov over two sites, at the studios Gallery and Garden off Station Road and at St Peters Church.

The exhibition grew from Septembers Oxfordshire 'Great Big Green Week' and as part of the WWF 'Just Imagine' project -imagining different potential futures and creating art which puts nature at the heart of our decision making; to be exhibited coinciding with the Climate Change Conference in Glasgow (COP-26).

Jack Cowley and Ayres House Studio artists, Emma Souter and Karen Goonewardene, ran free workshops during September supported by the WWF. From this process, Emma and Karen are curating the exhibit which includes work by professional artists and the public.

At the studios Gallery & Garden: Studio artists will be joined by marine conservation artist Jack Cowley (WWF Just Imagine Winner) and selected works from the hugely successful 'Green Art Trail'; a collaboration between Watlington Artists and various local environmental groups to raise awareness of local habitats and biodiversity. (Closed Wednesdays)

At St Peter's Church: There will be a clay community art installation 'Please handle with care', by Adumbration Arts. A body of clay figures, individually created by the community, installed alongside the root sculptures and drawings of Neocartouche from the 1st-2nd, and the photographs of glowing 'Exo Earth' planets, an exhibition by @john.granizophotography, from the 5th-7th & 11th -14th.

Both sites open 11am-5pm. Only a 5 minute flat walk between venues or parking available at both.

It's a busy time for the studios, planning the Christmas events too! From November there are decoration workshops, the Gallery will be open for Christmas shopping daily from 1st to the 14th Dec with the Xmas Market on the 5th Dec. 




'exo earth at St.Peter's' 5-7 and 11-14 November 2021

Wallingford Wine of the Month

As winter draws in, the natural reaction for all of us wine lovers is to pull up a blanket, light a fire and open a bottle of red. A good bottle of wine when it's cold outside is one of life's little comforts: warming, delicious, and the perfect complement to a hearty meal and good conversation.

As such, I've resisted a natural temptation to highlight some customer favourites from our first month: columns I could have written on Sancerre. Gavi, Provence Rosé, and New Zealand Sauvignon are therefore all shelved for future instalments. Instead, we're heading to northern Italy, and the luxurious deep cherry flavours that are the hallmark of that region. Our wine of the month is



the fabulous FortErcole from Tenuta Santi Giacomo e Filippo.

The FortErcole wine is a gentle twist on a classic: a blend of two iconic grapes from Tuscany, taken 100 miles east to the lesser known but arguably even more beautiful region of Marche. Sangiovese is the signature grape of Tuscany, and will be familiar to many as the backbone of wines such as Chianti, Brunello di Montalcino and Vino Nobile di Montepulciano. Montepulciano, on the other hand, is most commonly found in Montepulciano d'Abruzzo*. The grapes are fermented in large barrels, then aged for 3 years in old oak to soften the wine, giving it a silky but robust character when it hits the glass.

The wine is produced by a family-run, organic vineyard in the heart of a nature reserve just outside Urbino, the home of artist Raphael. The vineyard has been organic since it was planted in 1997, way before it was cool, and the sense of permanence and belonging is highlighted by the winemaker's tribute to her grandfather Ercole, a man for whom "every grape was important".

The result is a magnificent, substantial but lovable wine: cherry the main flavour, backed up by a spicy body and the gentlest notes of hedgerow berries. Soft enough to drink on its own, but substantial enough to enhance robust mushroom or meat dishes; there is real elegance behind the rustic façade. It's a fabulous wine to have in the rack – smart enough for a dinner party, but such good value you might be tempted to open it on a school night...



As we head into the Autumn months and the nights begin closing in, the Royal Standard certainly ticks all the boxes for those seeking a warm welcome, excellent pub food and of course, those all important locally made real ales.


