As the nights start to draw in...

Autumn in the bookselling world is a deluge of new titles, but biggest among these is the second book by **Richard Osman coming on the 16th September, The Man Who Died Twice**. In honour of that I thought we'd have a crime fiction review. I LOVE a good murder, and as Wallingford is the resting place of the Queen of Crime, Agatha Christie, it seems appropriate!

Magpie Lane by Lucy Atkins is an Oxford based psychological thriller about a nanny brought in to look after the silent daughter of a new college master. It is atmospheric, dark, and twisty and being that close to Oxford you can follow the plot mentally through the streets.
One By One by Ruth Ware sees the board of a dot com business trapped by an avalanche. They are there to discuss a deal that could make some of them millionaires but who will resort to murder to get their share? Black Drop by Leonora Nattrass is set in 1794 just as the rumblings of revolution are being felt in France and Britain's relations with its American colonies is on a knife edge. Laurence Jago has hidden his past from his government employers but now secrets that could destroy the British Army have gone missing and his dead colleague being blamed. Laurence relies on the Black Drop to still his nightmares but is it these he needs to face to find answers?

My favourite book, I think, of the whole year is **The Appeal by Janice Hallett**. It is an epistolary novel derived from the case notes of a murder, handed from a QC to his juniors to investigate with clear eyes. In a small town drama group tensions have been growing and one of their members will end up dead – **maybe the Sinodun Players should take extra care?!**

All the books are already arriving for the festive season so there will be plenty to keep us entertained by the fireside this year...



Chris Boyce: Benjamin Disraeli - Life and Times

Benjamin Disraeli (1804 - 1881) was a politician and a novelist during the Victorian age. The only British Prime Minister of Jewish descent, who became a favourite of Queen Victoria during a time when the country underwent significant change and became a world power. Although often considered something of an outsider during his life, he became Prime Minister twice and Chancellor of the Exchequer three times. The Primrose League was formed shortly after his death and was one of the biggest political movements of the 19th Century.

10 Nov (Weds)

Stephen Barker: 'Five Indian Pilots of the Great War'

In November 1916, the Royal Flying Corps began an experiment to recruit for the first time, Indians resident in Britain. Prior to that, men such as these were unable to enlist owing to a 'colour-bar'. Why was there a change of policy and what would be the experiences of these five men? The presentation is fully illustrated and includes both audio and video clips.

Stephen Barker is a Heritage Adviser, specialising in consultancy for those applying to fund projects with military history themes. He specialises in work relating to the First World War and British Civil Wars. His interest lies in promoting people's understanding of their military heritage, making the past interesting, relevant and exciting for a variety of different audiences. 

Art Classes in Cholsey

My name is Jo Wilson and I'm an artist and qualified art teacher, living in Cholsey, South Oxfordshire. I started teaching Art for All classes in 2016 when a friend asked me to fill in for someone and I decided to take it on permanently.

I've since moved venue and adapted the classes to suit any ability of participant, so that the classes are accessible and enjoyable. The classes are aimed at anyone from age 13 years upwards, although many who have attended in the past are retired or working part-time, the classes are also open to teenagers who are home educating.

Every term there is a different theme, and each class has a different subject and artistic medium so during the term you will experience and develop a wide rangeof skills. Everything you need will be provided including all artistic materials



required, even refreshments, although you may choose to bring your own apron and cup.

Art for All classes take place at **Cholsey Community Library**, which is based in the **Cholsey Pavilion, Station Road, Cholsey, OX10 9PT**. There is free parking, but it is also very close to Cholsey train station and the 136 bus stop from Wallingford and Benson.

Classes take place every **Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 10-11.30am** term time only. Each class costs just £10 per class but a term must be booked in advance. There are only 6 places in each class so please book early to avoid disappointment. 



GG Wildlife Experiences It's a Hoot!



We already know we are incredibly lucky to live in such a beautiful location, of scenic countryside and amazing wildlife. Many of us might hear the evening and night time calls of different evening creatures, the most recognisable for some being the Tawny Owl.

We hear them very loudly and actively in the area around February time when they are starting to look for a mate. Some will refer to the "twit – twoo" of an Owl; in fact, this is actually two different owls calling - the high pitched "kee-wick" of the female Tawny Owl which is responded to by the long note of the "twoooooo" of the male. This dating ritual has kept many of us awake at night during early Spring!

This is just one of the interesting facts guests of the Owl Walks over the last two Summers' have been learning, as part of the GG Wildlife Experiences guided Owl Walks. "We are really lucky to live in an area which has four different types of Owls all sighted in a small radius. Whilst the Short Eared Owls and Barn Owls are a less common sight for most, it's been delightful to show a number of local residents the families of Little Owls we have nesting and breeding here in Goring & Streatley, and to help them learn more about the Little Owls we see, and the Tawny Owls we hear and sometimes also get to see too".

Steve Gozdz started Goring Gap Wildlife Walks back in 2019; with a background in Wildlife Photography and a love of Wildlife, most notably Birds, the career move into providing guided walks was a natural step. This has now broadened into Experiences, hence the re-name; "We now offer guided Wildlife Spotting Boat Trips, and even Nature Breaks, so expanding the business and rebranding made sense, to show we now offer so much more".

So why is it great to help people learn about wildlife whilst exploring our countryside? "The more people understand about our local Wildlife, the greater their interest, and then a lot of people want to know about how to protect it, how to create good habitats in their garden or on their land to allow wildlife to flourish – which is a great way to protect and grow those species we really want to see thrive", says Steve.

So much so, that last year following popular demand after the Owl Box, Steve turned his Woodwork skills to good use and began creating and installing custom handmade Owl Boxes for those in the local area. "You can't just put any box up and hope for the best. Different Owls require different habitats and very different homes; it also depends if you are creating just a roost, or are creating a nesting location". This is why you can't just purchase a box; Steve will first come and survey your garden or land and advise on the most appropriate box for the Owl type you are likely to have frequent your garden. And in some cases, he has advised against buying one, as the habitat just hasn't been right. "The environment needs to be suitable for a long term habitat in order for the wildlife to flourish, and so I want to ensure we give the right advice, and give the wildlife the best chance".

A new request end of last year was Bat Boxes, and Steve began installing these for customers who have enjoyed seeing them in the garden and wanted to provide a safe haven for them.

As the Owl Season comes to an end re guided walks, Steve is now busy with a series of Owl Box orders as we head towards the roosting wintering period, and ready for the next year's mating period when new pairs will need to find new homes.....


